

## Keynote Speaker

### Judge Laurie Halfpenny MacQuarrie

Development and accomplishments of the Indigenous Healing to Wellness and Gladue Court in Wagmatcook, Cape Breton.

In her keynote address, Judge Halfpenny MacQuarrie will describe and discuss the development and accomplishments of the Indigenous Healing to Wellness and Gladue Court in Wagmatcook, Cape Breton. Judge Halfpenny MacQuarrie was instrumental in establishing this court in 2018 and has been the driving force keeping it running ever since (Rankin, 2018). This provincial court is a therapeutic court, which provides an alternative to detention, taking a restorative approach to address underlying issues such as addictions, mental health issues, and poverty, for both youth and adults. It accomplishes this through a variety of social services, including counselling, family therapy, cognitive behavioural counselling, employment counselling, mentoring, parent training, peer counselling, and mediation. In addition to effectively decriminalizing poverty, helping people to be well and avoid interactions with the law, and being a shining example of reconciliation in action, this court shows how psychological principles can be applied to the justice system. Psychological constructs of identity relation, empathy, morality, and motivation underlie restorative justice approaches (Nascimento et al., 2023; Wenzel et al., 2008), thus showcasing how psychology can influence the justice system beyond more obvious clinical psychological applications.

Dr. Brodersen completed her undergraduate degree in psychology at the University of New Brunswick and her graduate degrees at Simon Fraser University.

#### Jennaecia Lewis, B.A. (Honours), Diploma (Secondary Science Education)

Jennaecia Lewis, is a middle school science teacher, and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Coordinator. Ms. Lewis was a biology teacher in the Caribbean before completing her undergraduate degree in psychology at Saint Mary's University.

#### Kathleen Hyland, M.Sc. Applied Psychology

Kathleen Hyland, is a research and statistical officer with the Nova Scotia Department of Justice, and Vice Chair of the board of directors for the Elizabeth Fry Society of Mainland Nova Scotia. Ms. Hyland completed an undergraduate degree in psychology at St. Francis Xavier University and a Master's of Science in Applied Psychology at Saint Mary's University.



## Awards

### **Science Communication Award**

The prize is awarded to the student who is best able to communicate a science topic to their peers. The award may be split into two prizes (one for an oral and one for a poster presentation) at the discretion of the judging committee. The award consists of a letter of commendation, a cash prize and the opportunity to work collaboratively with the Atlantic Student Research Journal (ASRJ) team to write and publish an article about the winner's research.

**Note on the ASRJ editorial process:** The Science Atlantic team will connect the winner with the Editor-in-Chief at the ASRJ. One of the ASRJ team members will work with the winner and direct them along the article creation process. Articles typically include an introduction of the researcher and their field of study, a description of the research and a discussion relating to the importance of the research. Once the article has been approved it will be added to the ASRJ queue for publication. Once added, it can take between two weeks and two months to be published, depending on the current rate of article production.

### Undergraduate Research Award

This award (Formerly called the NSERC Representatives' Undergraduate Student Award, from 2004 to 2012) is presented to the student (or students) giving the best research presentation(s) at an annual Science Atlantic conference. The Award consists of a cash prize and a letter of commendation and can be split into oral and poster presentation prizes.

### The Karen Nicholson Award in Neuropsychology

The Karen Nicholson Award in Neuropsychology (first presented in May 2008) is presented annually for the best Neuropsychology undergraduate presentation (oral or poster) at the Science Atlantic Psychology Conference. Preference will be given to presentations dealing with human neuropsychology





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
