Does the abstract fit into one of the Showcase's project categories (a Prisma Health priority)? Are the preliminary data/literature references provided adequate to justify the project? Methods / Methodological Approach <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is the design of the project appropriate for the questions posed? Are the proposed outcome measures appropriate for design and project rationale? Are the investigative/programmatic methods/interventions appropriately related to the project intent? 	1 2 3 4 5
Results <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How relevant are the ideas presented to the health science field? Is the matter discussed/presented logically? Did the results explain what was expected, discovered, accomplished, collected, and/or produced? 	1 2 3 4 5
