Written Abstract <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is there a clear statement of the project's purpose or significance? Are the investigative methods appropriately related to the project intent? Is there a clear summary of the findings/results? Does the abstract fit into one of the Showcase's project categories (a Prisma Health priority)? 	1 2 3 4 5
Purpose Statement <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Are the preliminary data/literature references provided adequate to justify the project? Is there current attention to the topic? Is the project unique, unexpected, or represent a niche area in the body of work? 	1 2 3 4 5
Methods / Methodological Approach <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is the design of the project appropriate for the questions posed? Are the proposed outcome measures appropriate for design and project rationale? Are the investigative/programmatic methods/interventions appropriately related to the project intent? 	1 2 3 4 5
Results <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Are the results substantial and sufficiently address the project's purpose? Did the results explain what was expected, discovered, accomplished, collected, and/or produced? 	1 2 3 4 5
Conclusion <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How relevant are the conclusions in contributing to the health science discipline? Are the conclusions supported by the results provided? 	1 2 3 4 5
Poster Design and Organization <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How effective is the poster visually? Is the poster visually engaging and appropriately highlights the project? How valuable is each figure or graph in furthering viewers' understanding of the subject? Is the poster logically organized? Does the poster flow from one part to the next? Is the poster text clearly written and free of significant grammatical problems? 	1 2 3 4 5

Scoring rubric:

- 5 (Excellent): extremely complete and accurate in every way
- 4 (Very Good): very minor omissions in detail but not in content
- 3 (Good): a small weakness found in content or format
- 2 (Fair): an important weakness found in content or format
- 1 (Poor): a major weakness found in content or format

*Scores of 1 or 5 should only be used in exceptional cases.
